Weatherize before the weather cools down

Sealing and insulating is an easy, cost-effective way to save money while keeping your home cool during summer and warm in winter. You could get up to \$2,100 back in rebates when you upgrade your home's insulation, air sealing and duct sealing.

Set it and save

Washington state law recommends that home water heaters be set to no higher than 120 degrees Fahrenheit, or the low setting. This prevents scalding accidents and saves energy.

You could save up to 50 percent per year on your electric water-heating costs. If you're a PSE electric customer, you could qualify for a rebate up to \$800 on a qualifying heat pump water heater.
